Reading an article from Peachtree Toastmasters of Atlanta GA. <http://www.peachtreetm.org/executivecommittee/> really described our executive roles with great detail as you will see below. Each officer role is explained carefully. Please consider participating in our club as leader for our upcoming year. It will provide you with great leadership training.

Fluor Communicators elects its officers once a year. Our officers serve a full year's term, from July 1 to June 30. If you are interested in serving as an officer, please speak to any of the executive before the end of April, so that you can learn more about the office you wish to hold.

Serving as an officer in Toastmasters is an important part of building leadership skills. As an officer, you will work with a team closely to manage the finances of the club, set the schedule of meetings, hold special functions such as contests and the awards banquet, and solicit and welcome new members and guests to our club.

President – Richard Mowry

The President is responsible for the overall performance of the club. He/she leads the executive committee (made up of all the officers). On the Area and Division level, he/she represents the club to the rest of Area 23, District 42 Toastmasters.

Vice President Education – Maureen Towns

The VP Ed sets the schedule for the club through the use of easy-Speak. He/she is responsible for creating and publishing the schedule, and working with the other officers to create special formats and fun, challenging meetings. He/she works with the Contest Chair to oversee the scheduling of contests. The VP Education works with individual members to help them along in achieving their individual goals. He/she also shares responsibility in working toward club goals, specifically, the Distinguished Club Program. The VP Education is widely acknowledged to be the most demanding role as an officer in the club.

Vice President Membership – Helga Bender

The VP Membership welcomes our guests and ensures that their paperwork is completed before processing them as new members. He/she plans (as needed) orientation sessions for new members to help them grow accustomed to Toastmasters etiquette and tradition. When necessary, he/she is responsible for coming up with membership programs designed to increase the number of members in our club.

Vice President Public Relations – Wanda Weston

The VP Public Relations is the first point of contact for all club inquires and external affairs. His/her contact information is published on the Toastmasters International website as well as the club website. The VP Public Relations also coordinates with the club webmaster on our web site including updating the club events calendar and membership roster. The VP PR also works with the VP Membership to help publicize the club to attract new members and guests.

Secretary – Andrea Corlett

The Secretary takes attendance for the club and also records the minutes at the executive committee meetings. The Secretary is also responsible for organizing the club's supplies and ordering additional supplies as necessary.

Treasurer – Matt Fox

The Treasurer is the club accountant and keeps the bank records for the club. This position requires to be filled by a Fluor employee. He/she assists the President in setting the budget, and then holds the club to that budget. He/she is responsible for the reporting of the finances to the President on a regular basis, and for disbursing the funds to members who incur expenses on behalf of the club. The Treasure collects new member dues and facilitates the processing of the new-member application with TMI. The Treasurer is also responsible for collecting renewal dues from existing members, submitted twice a year in March and September.

Sergeant At Arms – Chris Villalva, Co-Sergeant At Arms – Billy Michel Vital

The Sergeant At Arms is in charge of the overall professionalism of the club. This position requires to be filled by a Fluor employee. He/she needs to arrive prior to the meeting to set up the room prior to every meeting. During the meeting, he/she assists in the passing of the comment and evaluation slips, as well as the admission of late arrivals so they don't distract from the speakers at the lectern. Following the meeting, he/she straightens up the room and returns the Toastmaster equipment to our closet.

Immediate Past President – Doina Cocis

The immediate past President is an official member of the club executive committee. His/her responsibilities are to support the President.

Q&A WITH CLUB INTERNATIONAL SPEECH CONTEST WINNER 2014 - HELGA BENDER

What is the title of your winning speech?

The title of the speech was "Goodbye Anger, Hello Freedom".

What message did you want to deliver to the audience in this speech?

I choose to speak about forgiveness because it made such a liberating difference in my life. Everyone needs to forgive someone and I hoped someone could benefit from my story. I had to forgive the convicted driver that killed my son or it would destroy me like a slow poison. Although I grieved the loss of my 25 year old son, I still needed to forgive the driver's carelessness and dangerous driving that took his life. My son was an amazing humanitarian and visionary. On graduation from university he toured Eastern Africa with friends. He visited the genocide sites in Rwanda, and was moved to help establish a school to rebuild this devastated nation. He poured the concrete foundations but also set up all the computer systems - his degree was in computer science, following in his mother's footsteps.

He also worked on the documentary "Hope Rises" about how the school was raising up future leaders to help Rwanda recover. He left a huge impact on the world even in his short years. As his mother, it was like my heart was ripped open when he was killed and somehow I wanted someone to pay but who could pay back his life. I had to let go of my anger and forgive the driver to get free of bitterness. Forgiveness has set me free and I found peace and rest in my life again. It set me free to redirect my energies to living and loving life again. Hopefully that will help someone else who has suffered injustice too, because injustice comes to so many of us.

What advice would you give fellow members that may consider entering upcoming speech contests?

Tell your own story. Tell the impactful lessons you have learned even if they are hard ones, and it will impact others. Also, I am grateful for amazing mentors who have helped me see what was extraneous and what worked. They have helped me move my speaking up into a much more powerful realm.

What is your next big goal that you have your sights on, in and outside of Toastmasters?

I love the medium of storytelling. I want to explore that further both in and out of Toastmasters. I am also considering other platforms for my forgiveness speech, to reach more people.

In addition, having won a little short story contest, I also am exploring ideas of writing and blogging.

What advice would you give fellow members that may consider entering upcoming speech contests?

I would advise that they prepare at least a couple weeks in advance and use the 2 weeks leading up to the contest to practice daily. Contests can add more pressure and nerves so being more confident in the speech is a necessity. On Contest day don't leave anything on the stage. Go for it and push yourself.

You placed first in the Club Speech Evaluation contest. Congratulations! What advice can you give others to provide a positive, yet constructive evaluation to the speaker?

Write down both growth areas and areas they did well and use the sandwich approach in your presentation. Give examples of how they can improve in addition to the constructive feedback. So don't be afraid to give constructive help. That's what speakers want to hear.

What is your next big goal that you have your sights on, in and outside of Toastmasters?

My big goal is to win the area contest and build my business to increase profits.

How has your personal and professional experience been coming to Calgary and working at Fluor for the work /study program through Waterloo University?

Ian: So far my experience with Fluor and Calgary has been fantastic. Fluor is a great company to work for, and it's been a new experience for me to be exposed to large scaled projects. I have learned a lot here, and have also enjoyed some of the other benefits such as Fluor Fridays, and of course Toastmasters. At first I was hesitant to move to Calgary, but now I love it here. I love snowboarding, and have made the best of my four months out here by visiting most of the large ski hills in the area. I've had some fantastic weekends and will certainly miss Calgary.

Naeem: The professional experience I have gained through the co-op program is amazing. Being here in Fluor I have gained exposure to so many different fields and disciplines. This experience would have never been possible if it wasn't for the co-op program at Waterloo.

Brendan: Both my personal and professional experiences have been unforgettable. I have been able to learn and work with great individuals ranging from new graduates to experts who have over 25 years of working experience, which is very valuable. I have also enjoyed living in Calgary because it has many activities to offer but it still has the small city feeling to it, so it is not overwhelming.

Sonny: I am an international student going into 4th year this spring, and this is my 5th work term. This was my first time working outside of Ontario, and it has been definitely my No.1 favorite co-op term. For once I wanted to work somewhere far, and just right in time I was given a great opportunity by Fluor. To me, Fluor was unique in a sense that they valued diversity. I previously had 4 work terms at different companies, but I had never seen so many people from different culture working together in harmony. Also, people in Calgary are more friendly, kind, and easy going that it was easier for me to quickly adopt myself to this new environment.

What made you decide to come to a Toastmasters' meeting?

Ian: On my first day at Fluor, I saw a link on the e-news email about Toastmasters. It didn't take much of a decision for me to go, I'd heard of Toastmasters and despite never participating in it before it seemed like a great opportunity to me. I showed up the first week and haven't turned back.

Naeem: It just sounded like an awesome club where you get to practice a very valuable life skill, communicating. I also really enjoy giving and hearing speeches and where better to get that than Toastmasters.

Brendan: I decided to go to a Toastmasters' meeting because I wasn't confident in my public speaking skills and I often found myself getting very nervous any time I had to speak in front of a crowd. I saw Toastmasters as a great opportunity to become a more confident speaker with the ability to capture the interest of my audience; I skill I envied in other great speakers.

Sonny: As an international student who speaks English as a second language, I always wanted to improve my communication skills. About a year ago I learned about this group. I was interested, but I didn't look for one around me to join. When it was finalized that I would be working for Fluor, the first thing came up to my mind was joining this meeting at Fluor.

The first meeting was great. I heard two great speeches. Todd was giving his first speech that I could picture myself standing in his position and giving a speech. His hands were shaking a little from nervousness, but when I saw his eyes I could feel his strong will and confidence in him to deliver his story to the audience. He looked great, and I thought to myself 'That could be me'. Then Helga gave her last CC manual speech and it was astonishing. She just blew my mind. It made me want to come to this meeting every week and listen to great speeches. Then I was selected as a table topic speaker.

I stepped out of my comfort zone without an hesitation, which was a big step for an introvert like me, and tried my best. Everyone gave me praise and I felt really good about myself. I got very motivated by the members. What's next? I joined the group immediately.

How has your brief involvement in Toastmasters' benefitted you?

Ian: Toastmasters has been very beneficial for me. It can be hard to get comfortable talking in front of people - I find it especially difficult in a professional or semi-formal environment. Toastmasters has been a great way for me to get a little bit more experience, and on top of this meet some new people. I'm new to Calgary so meeting new people and hearing their stories gives me the opportunity to learn a bit about the city, and hear of things around town that I'd like to do.

Naeem: I have gained a lot so far from Toastmasters including practicing my speech skills both scripted and non-scripted. I have also heard some very great speeches and evaluations. My most enjoyed time at Toastmasters would have to be the Table Topics though. It forces you to think on your feet and work up the ability to solve problems right away.

Brendan: I have been able to hear and learn from great speakers every week at Toastmasters. My first speech and other various roles I performed, have allowed me to gain some confidence in my ability to speak and allowed me to set future goals for myself. I now look forward to every speaking opportunity because it allows me to practice and become a better communicator.

Sonny: I gained so much confidence. It was not that I studied more grammar or vocabulary, but just from gaining confidence I could communicate better with others. Toastmasters not only enabled me to see my strengths and weaknesses in communication, but also guided me to improve and enhance them. Organized manuals; a great mentor; encouraging members; and fun meetings always stimulate me to try different roles and learn from different perspectives. Most important above all, the meetings were always fun, and I had such a enjoyable time!
