# **Triple Crown Award**

The Triple Crown award in Toastmasters is a prestigious recognition that honours members who demonstrate exceptional dedication and commitment to their personal and professional development. To achieve the Triple Crown award, a Toastmasters member must accomplish three important milestones within a single Toastmasters year, which runs from July 1st to June 30th.

The three milestones required to earn the Triple Crown award are:

1) Completing three educational awards: This involves earning any combination of three educational awards from the Pathways program, such as Level Completion, Mentorship or DTM.

2) Serving as a Club Officer: Members need to serve as a Club Officer in one of the Toastmasters club's executive roles, such as President, Vice President of Education, Vice President of Membership, Vice President of Public Relations, Secretary, Treasurer, or Sergeant at Arms.

3) Participating in a District-sponsored event: This requires attending and actively participating in a District-sponsored event, such as a District conference, contest, or training session.

By accomplishing these three milestones within the same Toastmasters year, members earn the Triple Crown award, which symbolizes their dedication, commitment, and exemplary engagement in Toastmasters activities. The award recognizes their commitment to personal growth, leadership development, and active participation within the Toastmasters community. It showcases their dedication to becoming effective communicators, confident leaders, and valuable contributors to their Clubs and Districts.
